GOLD has advised that from 1940 to the departure of Semen SEMENOV, whom he knew as SAM, SEMENOV had been his superior in the Sov esp apparat for which he worked. After the departure of SEMENOV from the US he was taken over by YAKOVLEV whom he knew as JOHN who continued to run him until 1946. (New York Times, 17 November 1950).

CONTACTS

Gold, Harry, a subject in the FUCHS Case. YAKOVLEV along with SEMENOV was GOLD's superior in the apparatus.
GREENGLASS, David. Allegedly in June 1945 when contact between GOLD and GREENGLASS was established in Albuquerque, N.M., GOLD gave GREENGLASS \$500 which had come from his Soviet superior, YAKOVLEV.
ROSENBERG, Julius and Ethel. Reported YAKOVLEV was the superior in the esp network of the ROSENBERGS (for further info see card on ROSENBERGS).

It has been learned that the "Washington Evening Star" of October 14, 1947, contains an article by George Weller, special correspondent of the "Star" and the "Chicago Daily News," entitled "Vast Program by Communists to Dominate World Disclosed." In addition, and in connection with Weller's article, the "Star" presented a chart of the vast Communist organization in France. The chart depicted a flow of intel info to the Politburo through the Soviet Government operations in Paris. Two main outlets from the Sov Dip Mission in Paris were shown and under the caption "Political Police MVD were listed the names ABRABOV, JAKOVLEV, SMIRNOV. The chart showed that the Russian Pol. Police in Paris were directly associated with the Embassy of the USSR in Paris.

Anatoli Jacob IAKOVLEV, whose photo was identified by Gold as his Soviet espionage superior "John" was reported to have taken over FILATOV's duties as Chief of the Soviet Repatriation Mission. It is believed that this info establishes that the Jakowlev shown on the Star's chart is identical with Harry GOLD's Soviet espionage superior Anatoli Antonovich YAKOVLEV.

YAKOVLEV's position with GOLD was taken over by SARYCHEV, Filip Tikhonovich. There was some time lapse between the two contacts.

ESPIONAGE

Harry GOLD has advised that he received expense money from all his Sov superiors: from YAKOVLEV he rec'd a total of ca \$750 to \$1,000. GOLD has also advised that in his last meeting with YAKOVLEV, 26 Dec 46, YAKOVLEV gave him 2 or 3 hundred \$ for his past espionage expenses; at that time GOLD didn't give him a receipt, although normally he did. At that meeting with YAKOVLEV, YAKOVLEV told GOLD to prepare for a trip to Paris in early spring 1947. GOLD was to meet a Frenchman at a subway stop in Paris; the man was to approach GOLD and give him certain info which GOLD would then take to England and turn over to a subsequent contact. At about this point, YAKOVLEV asked GOLD where he was employed, and when GOLD said he was employed by BROTHMAN, YAKOVLEV got very upset and left, not completing his discussion. GOLD has advised that he believed this European assignment had to do with collecting Atomic info and that it would maybe involve more than one European trip. GOLD has also advised that on at least two occasions, YAKOVLEV told him he'd introduce GOLD to a young woman, whose husband was in the US Army, who would perform the function of doing leg work between YAKOVLEV and GOLD. GOLD recalled that she lived in upper Manhattan, in the neighborhood of Lexington Ave. and she may have been Russian born or of Russian descent, although GOLD never did meet her. (DFB-34870)
